A LOCAL LAW PROVIDING FOR A

CODE OF ETHICS

Local Law #1 of 2007

Be it enacted by the Town Board of the Town of Howard, in the County of Steuben, as follows:

SECTION 1. PURPOSE AND INTENT

- A. The Town recognizes that there are state statutory provisions mandating towns to establish rules and standards of ethical conduct for public officers and employees that, if observed, can enhance public confidence in local government. In the light of a tendency today on the past of some people to downgrade our local governments and to discredit our public servants and our free institutions generally, it appears necessary that every effort be made to assure the highest caliber of public administration of this town as part of our state's important system of local government. It is the purpose of this chapter to implement this objective through the establishment of standards of conduct, to provide for punishment of violation of such standards.
- B. The standards, prohibited acts and procedures established in this chapter are in addition to any prohibited acts, conflicts of interest provisions or procedures prescribed by statute of the state of New York and also in addition to common law rules and judicial decisions relating to the conduct of town officers to the extent that the same are more severe in their application.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS

The term "town employee" means any compensated commissioner, member of a public board or commission, trustee, director, officer, employee of any other person holding a position by election, appointment or employment in the service of the town.

SECTION 3. STANDARD RESTRICTIONS

A "town employee" shall not knowingly or intentionally:

- A. Accept other employment that will impair his or her independence of judgment in the exercise of his or her official duties;
- B. Accept employment or engage in any business or professional activity which will require him or her to disclose confidential information which he or she has gained by reason of his or her official position or authority;

- C. Use or attempt to use his or her official position to secure unwarranted privileges or exemptions for himself or herself, or others:
- D. Engage in any transaction as a representative or agent of the town with any business entity in which he or she has a direct or indirect financial interest that might reasonably tend to conflict with the proper discharge of his or her official duties;
- E. By conduct give reasonable basis for the impression that any person can improperly influence him or her or unduly enjoy his or her favor in the performance of his or her official duties, or that he or she is affected by the kinship, rank, position or influence by any party or person;
- F. Make personal investments in enterprises which he or she has reason to believe may be directly involved in decisions to be made by him or her or which will otherwise create substantial conflict between his or her duty in the public interest and his or her private interest;
- G. Pursue a course of conduct that will raise suspicion among the public that he or she is likely to be engaged in acts that are in violation of law or trust;
- H. Sell goods or services to any person, firm, corporation or association who is licensed or whose rates are fixed by the town.

SECTION 5. ADMINISTRATION

- A. Upon the adoption of this Code of Ethics, the town supervisor shall cause a copy thereof to be distributed to every "town employee". Failure to distribute any such copy or failure of any "town employee" to have received such copy shall have no effect on the duty of compliance with this Code of Ethics, nor the enforcement of the provisions hereof.
- B. The town supervisor shall further cause a copy of this Code of Ethics to be kept posted conspicuously in each public building under the jurisdiction of the town. Failure to so post this Code of Ethics shall have no effect on the duty of compliance herewith, nor the enforcement provisions hereof.
- C. Within thirty (30) days of the adoption of this Code of Ethics, the town clerk shall file a copy thereof in the office of the State Comptroller.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing in the office of the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
